

AFFIDAVIT

Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared C.T. Weldon, who being duly sworn deposes and says that he resides in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, and has for more than forty years last past; that he knew W.R. Self and his wife, T. E. Self during their life times; that they formerly lived in the town of Wilsonville, but for a number of years prior to their deaths they were residents of the State of Mississippi; that Mrs T. E. Self, the wife of W. R. Self dies in Meridian Mississippi, during the year 1909, and she was brought to the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, and buried in the Wilsonville cemetery; that the said W. R. Self is also dead, having died within a year after the death of his wife.

Affiant being further sworn deposes and says that he was the mortgagor in that certain instrument executed by C. T. Weldon and wife, Gladys Weldon to H. L. and M. M. Smith, dated March 13, 1923, and recorded in Mortgage Book 133, on page 569, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; affiant further says that H.L. Smith became Cashier of the Wilsonville State Bank, soon after the date of said mortgage and that affiant knows of his own knowledge that said mortgagees, as named above, transferred and assigned said mortgage to said bank and that affiant paid the indebtedness due under said mortgage to said bank, and that said ^{mortgage} was delivered to affiant by the said bank, at the time it was paid but that he has either lost said mortgage, or that the same has been destroyed, and the transfer of the same was never placed on record.
