Before me L. H. Ellis, a Notary Public in and for said County, in said State, personally appeared, Chart Glass, who is known to me and who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am acquainted with the south west quarter of the south west quarter of Section 36, Township 21, Range 2 West, Shelby County, Alabama, and have known said land for forty years or more. Prior to January 15, 1914, Jasper Holcombe was in possession of this forty acre tract of land, claiming to own it and on the 15th day of January, 1914, he deeded the same to Richard H. Holcombe by deed which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 55 at page 458; and on said date said Richard H. Holcombe deeded said land to affiant, and affiant went into possession of said land and remained in the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of same until the 15th day of January, 1915, at which time affiant deeded the same to W. L. Guins, and immediately upon the execution of said last named deed said Guins went into possession of said land and remained in the actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of same until he deeded it to Shelby Springs Amusement Company on the 24th day of April, 1915. I am informed that these deeds were filed for record in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, but for some reason they were never recorded. I know, however, of the existence of said deeds and know that they were properly executed and delivered as hereinbefore set out. Said Richard H. Holcombe is now dead but W. L. Guins is still living.
