Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared R. E. Brown, who being first duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now resides in Talladega County, Alabama; that he formerly owned the hereinafter described property; that he is the R. E. Brown mentioned in that certain deed from Charles Faulk and wife, Mary E. Faulk to R. E. Brown dated March 3rd, 1927, and recorded in deed book 75, on page 560, conveying the following described lands, to-wit:

Tract 426, consisting of 8 acres more or less situated in Shelby County, Alabama, according to map and survey of G. B. Pickett which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, the same being further described as the $E\frac{1}{2}$ of $W\frac{1}{2}$ of Fractional $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20 Township 22, Range 2 West, situated in Shelby County, Alabama,

Affiant further says that the consideration for said conveyance was the sum of \$2300.00, for which he executed a mortgage and notes payable to the said Chas E. Faulk on March 3rd, 1927, being the same date of said deed and which said indebtedness and said consideration was paid in full to the said Chas. E. Faulk, on December 3rd, 1930, as shown by the record in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further says that it is his information that the said deed from Faulk to Affiant failed to recite the amount of the consideration, but that the amount is the sum expressed in the mortgage described in Mortgage Book 141 on page 353, in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama,

Affiant further says that he went into possession under and by virtue of the authority of the deed described from Charles Faulk to R. E. Brown, and has paid the purchase price, as recited above, in full.
