I am acquanted with the south east quarter of the north east quarter of Section 36, Township 20, South, Range 1 East, in Shelby County, Alabama, and have known said land for twenty years or more. I purchased all of this forty acres of land along with two other forties from R. J. Conn and Etta May Conn, on the 6th day of November 1913, except that portion thereof in the north west corner north of what its known as Spring Branch. The deed by which I obtained title to this land is recorded in the Probate Office of helby County, Alabama in deed book 52 at page 461, and when I obtained the deed from the Conns I went in possession under said purchase and under said deed of only that portion of said forty south of said Spring Branch. I do not know exactly the agreage contained in said exception, although my deed recites that it is half an acre, but it is really more than that and is probably somewhere between an acre, an acre and a half or two acres in area. I own this excepted area, however, having acquired title there to from other sources and am in possession of the entire forty, claiming to own it, That portion, however, north or northwest of Spring Branch in the north west corner of said forty, does not go with the Sommerville Place, which consists of the forty in question and two other forties adjoining, and which are offered to the Federal Land Bank of New Orleans as security for a ldan.
