Before me the undersigned authority in and for said County in said State personally appeared A. J. Robins, who being known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says that he is employed in the office of J. T. Stokely who is looking after the affairs of Buck Creek Cotton Mills and that deponent had in his possession last year the notes of C. L.
