Before me, the undersigned authority, in and for said State and County, as afore-said, personally appeared J. R. White, and H. S. Nelson, who being first duly sworn depose and say that they reside in the town of Columbiana, Alabama; that for a period of more than fifty years they have been acquainted with the location, boundaries, use, possession and ownership of the following described lot, or tract of land in the town of Columbiana, Shelby Alabama, to-wit:

That certain lot on the South side of Mildred Street, some times called White House Street, in the Town of Columbiana, Alabama, and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the Northeast corner of the Methodist Church Conference Home lot, which corner is marked by an iron stob in the ground at the South margin of the side walk on said street, run thence North 7 degrees and 10 minutes East along the South margin of said side walk a distance of 91 feet and 3 inches to the corner of the rock wall of Mrs. Knox E. K. Milner and John K. Milner were on and the same party and that they remember the occasion when the said John J. Milner conveyed a tract of land in the town of Columbiana, Alabama, which included the lot above described, to William R. A. Milner, dated December 17th, 1896, and which deed is recorded in Deed Book 26, on page 514, all in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; affiants further say that on January 17th, 10 1901, the said William R. A. Milner conveyed to the affiant, J. R. White, a tract of land which was a part of the above described lot, which deed is recorded in Deed Book 23, on page 314, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; affiants further say that on October 25th, 1902, William R. A. Hilner, conveyed to W. G. Parker a part of the los heretofore described, which deed is recorded in Deed Book 28, on page 76, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; that on November 7th, 1903, affiant, J. R. White, conveyed a tract of land, which was a part of the above described lot, to W. G. Parker, which is shown to be of record in Deed Book 27, on page 250, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama. Affiants further say that on November 16th, 1909, the said W. G. Parker conveyed a part of the above described lot, being 72 feet on Mildred or Milner Street and on the South side thereof, to J. T. MicMillan, and soon thereafter the said J. T. McMillan constructed a dwelling thereon and continued to reside therein and thereon up until the date of his death some time during the early part of the year 1917; that the said J. T. McMillan's widown, Mrs. E. M. McMillan, conveyed a part of the above described lot to Mrs. Susan McGehee Bird, being the same party as Mrs. Susie 6. Bird, on July 3rd, 1918, as shown in Deed Book 66 on page 68, and that Mrs. Susie C. Bird, being the same as Mrs. Susan McGehee Bird, on October 11th, 1920, conveyed a part of the above described lot to W. G. Parker, as shown by deed recorded in Deed Book 83, on page 219; that on August 17th 1928, W. G. Parker conveyed a part of the above described lot to Charles R. Tinney, being the same party as C. R. Tinney, as shown by the Deed Recorded in Deed Book 84, on page 28, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; that the said C. R. Tinney, on June 28th, 1930, conveyed a part of the above described lot to W. G. Parker, which deed

is shown of record in Deed Book 84, on page 589, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama; that W. G. Parker conveyed on July 29th, 1930, the above described lot, together with other lands to Mrs. Susie C. Bird, which deed is shown of record in Deed Book 89, on page 169, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, that on February 1st, 1934, Mrs. Susie C. Bird, conveyed the above described lot, together with other lands contiguous thereto to Mrs. Knox E. Wooley, which deed is shown of record in Deed Book 100, on page 39.

Affiants further say that when they can first remember when the said property was in the possession of J. K . Milner, that it was in cultivation and was regularly cultivated by the said J. K. Milner, or tenant, by the said William R. A. Milner, the affiant, Jr.R. White and W. G. Parker, up until the said W. G. Parker conveyed part of the above described lot to J. T. McMillan, who constructed a dwelling thereon and made the same his home continuously up until the early part of 1917, the date of his death; affiants further say that soon after the purchase of said property by the said W. G. Parker, from William R. A. Milner and J. R. white, as aforesaid, the said W. G. Parker built a residence upon the lot East and contiguous to the McMillan lot and continued to reside thereon for a number of years. There was situated upon both lots dwellings and out buildings; affiants further way that from the death of the said J. T. MdMillan up until the date of the conveyance by his widow to the said Susan Mc-Gehee Bird, that she was in the possession of said premises in person or by tenant up until the date of sale, as aforesaid; that the said Mrs. Bird was inthe possession of said property either in person or by tenant until the date of sale to the said W. G. Parker, as shown by the deed of conveyance of record; that the said W. G. Parker remained in possession of said property continuously upe until the date of sale of the same to the said Charles R. Tinney, and that after the purchase by the said Tinney he was in continuous possession of said lot by tenant until the same was re-conveyed to W. G. Pakker, as shown of record, who was in possession until he conveyed the property and lot to his step daughter, Mrs. Susie C. Bird; that the said Mrs. Susie C. Bird was in possession of said property by tenant from the date of sale by the said W. G. Parker, as aforesaid, until on or about the 31st day of December, 1931, at which time the dwelling situated upon said lot was destroyed by fire, and that from and after the said last named date the said Mrs. Bird was in the continuous possession of said property by tenant, using the out houses thereon fro storage purposes and cultivating the patched in connection with said lot; that since the date of said sale in February, 1934, to Mrs. Know E. Wooley, she has been in the continuous possession of said lot, using the same for a garage, poultry house, storage lot and for garden purposes, continuously up until the present time.

The affiants further say that of their own personal knowledge that they know that for more than fifty years last past, Mrs. Knox E. Wooley, and those through whom the said Mrs. Knox E. Wooley holds title to the above described lot have been respectively in the open, notorious, continuous, peaceable and adverse possession of said lot, claiming the same as their own respectively against all the world, and exercising acts of ownership, as heretofore named, over said lot; affiants have never heard the title of the said Mrs. Knox E. Wooley, or those through whome she holds title to said lands to be questioned in any way. Affiants further say that the land was used continuously and regularly for agricultural purposes from the year 1886, as afforesaid, up until the date of sale to the said J. T. McMillan, after which a residence was placed upon the lot above described, and that the same has been used as a residence lot continuously by the several owners or their agents, up until the date that the said building was destroyed by fire on December 31st, 1931, and since last named date said lot has been used as a garage, poultry lot, storage lot and as a garden tract.
