Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared C. T. Weldon, who being duly sworn, deposes and says that he resides at Wilsonville, Shelby County, Alabama; that he has been a resident of said town of Wilsonville, for more than forty years; that for a period of forty years, last past, he has been acquainted with the ownership, location, boundaries and use of the following described tract of land situated in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, to wit:

All that part of the West Half of the Northeast Quarter lying North of the Blue Springs public road, Section 1, Township 21, Range 1 East, except five acres in the Northeast corner described as follows, to wit: Beginning at the northeast corner of the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 1, Township 21, Range 1 East, and running South 350 yards to a point; thence run West 70 feet to a point; thence run North 350 yards to the North line of said West Half of the Northeast Quarter; run thence East along the North line of said West Half of the Northeast Quarter 70 yards to the point of beginning; the land herein described containing 73 acres, more or less and situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further says that when he can first remember and knew this land that it was owned and in possession of Mrs. R. C. J. Gwin, and that Mrs. Gwin and her agents and heirs-at-law, continued in possession of said land until the same was sold by a decree of the County <sup>County</sup> in May, 1910 to J. R. Black; that J. R. Black went in to possession of said land and remained in possession until the year 1912, at which time he sold said land to W. S. McEwen; that upon the purchase by the said McEwen he went into possession of the same and held possession until the year 1927, at which time he sold said lands to Sudduth Realty Company, incorporated, that said Sudduth Realty Company was in possession of said lands by agent and tenant up until the date of sale to T. L. Cook, and T. L. Cook remained in possession of said land until the date of sale to L. M. Warren, and since the sale to said Warren he has been in possession of said lands by tenant or agent until this date. Affiant further says that part of said tract of land is in cultivation and has been for more than forty years and that the remainder of which is in timber and that said tillable land and timber land has been so used by the respective owners for general agricultural uses.

Affiant further says of his own personal knowledge he knows that for more than forty years, last past, L. M. Warren and those through whom the said L. M. Warren claims, namely, - R. C. J. Gwin, J. R. Black, W. S. McEwen, Sudduth Realty Company, Inc., and T. L. Cook, through whom he holds title to the above described lands have been respectively in the open, notorious, continuous, peaceful and adverse possession of said lands, claiming the same as their own respectively against all the world, and exercising acts of ownership over said lands as herein stated; affiant further says he has never heard the title of the said L. M. Warren or those through whom he holds title to said lands to be questioned in any way.
