I knew Samuel S. Childers and was associated with him as a partner in the Shingle mill business in 1904, 1905 and 1906, Mr Childers and I gave a mortgage to the King Lumber Company on September 26, 1904, securing \$755.00 by eight notes of even date, one for \$65.00 due on December 1, 1904, and the balance for \$100 each, payable monthly with 8% interest on the following tract of land:

200 acres of land and all right and interest bought of J. P. Knabe and Scott and being the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ and the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of the $SW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 26, Township 19, Range 2 West,

recorded in Mortgage Book 68, page 222, in the office of the Judge of Probate in Shelby County, Alabama.

Shortly after the mortgage was given I withdrew from the partnership and conveyed all the interest that I had to Mr. S. S. Childers. At no time since that conveyance has Mr. Sibley P. King of the King Lumber Company mentioned anything to me about the mortgage. He has had ample opportunity to ask me about it, because I went to see him some years later and discussed with him the possibility of operating another shingle mill.

During the time that Mr. Childers and I operated the shingle mill, we averaged a net income of about \$500.00 per month. Mr Childers told me that he and Mr. King made monthly settlements; therefore, it is my belief that the mortgage has been satisfied.
