

RIGHT-OF-WAY DEED FOR PUBLIC ROAD

STATE OF ALABAMA,  
Shelby County.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, J. H. Thomason, and wife Mary Thomason, of the County and State aforesaid, in and for the consideration of one dollar 64.40 in hand paid by Board of Revenue of Shelby County the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and for the further consideration of the benefit accruing to us and to the public from the construction or improvement of a public road through our lands, in Shelby County, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Board of Revenue of Shelby County, its successors or assigns, a Right-of-way hereinafter described over and across our said lands in Shelby County, Ala., for a public road; Which right-of-way shall be 50 feet in width on each side of the center line of said road, as it is now located and staked out of the State Highway Department or as much of our lands as is required to make a 100 foot right-of way across our lands said right-of-way herein conveyed being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

A strip of land 100 feet wide lying 50 feet each side of and parallel to the center line of Federal Aid Project #99 as now staked out by the State Highway Department of Alabama. Beginning at station 778/50 and ending at station 792/65.

All of the above described land being in the E $\frac{1}{2}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 35, and NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 36, Township 20 S, Range 3 W, in Shelby County, Alabama.

J. H. Thomason reserves the timber now left standing on right-of-way.

To Have and To Hold by Board of Revenue of Shelby County or its Assigns, and for and in consideration of the benefit to our property by reason of the construction or improvement of said road, we hereby release the County aforesaid, and all of its employees and officers and the State of Alabama and all of its employees and officers from all consequential damages present or prospective, to our property, arising out of the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair of said road, and that said road is a benefit to our property is hereby admitted and acknowledged.


