Parker hereinabove referred to, namely: That certain mortgage recorded in Mortgage Book 87 at page 125, executed by J. B. Turner and wife Ola to W. P. Gilbert, for \$1,000., dated October, 1909 and also that certain mortgage recorded in Mortgage Book &1 at page 472, for \$1,500., executed by J. B. Turner and wife Ola to Mrs. N. E.
