On July 11, 1914, I purchased at tax sale the following among other lands, viz:

Said lands were purchased by me as aforesaid under an assessment to John L. Goodson for the year 1913 and said sale was for the payment and collection of 1913 taxes thereon and was made by the Tax Collector of Shelby County, Alabama. I understand that Tax Sale Record #4 at page 90 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, shows that this sale made on July 11, 1914, under an assessment to John L. Goodson was to the State of Alabama. As stated, however, the sale was made to me and a certificate was issued to me by G. W. Weaver, Judge of Probate, showing that I was the purchaser at said sale. Mr. John L. Goodson redeemed this land from this tax sale, paying me the money I had paid out with interest thereon, and I delivered the certificate to him and this is to certify that I have no further interest in the land nor title thereto. This redemption was effected shortly after the date of said sale.
