My father, John W. Nabors, was in possession of this land, claiming to own it on



Under the last mentioned deed, I west in possession of the land above described, living upon it and cultivating portions of it each and every year to the present time. When I say that I cultivated portions of it each year I mean that I either cultivated it myself or had it done.

What I have said about being in possession of said land and the description thereof. I wish to modify to this extent, and that is, the line commencing at the point of beginning of the land described by metes and bounds above mentioned and running north 83 degrees 20 minutes east 643 feet, is a made line which was agreed upon between me and the then owner, Mr. A. A. Roebuck, sometime about 1920. The old deeds called for a gin house lot and we straightened the line so as to fix the north boundary of my property as described above, and I have been in possession of said land up to said line, actually cultivating it or having it done since the agreement was made aforementioned, and even for a long time prior thereto.
