Whatley in 1899, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 22 at page 183.

E. S. Whatley was a brother of T. W. Whatley and M. A. Whatley was the mother of both T. W. Whatley and E. S. Whatley. Mrs. M. A. Whatley and E. S. Whatley both died intestate prior to the year 1914.
