Cross, Sr., who, on the 1st day of February, 1881, conveyed a part of said land to James Cost & Son, has been dead for more than three years; and that Ollie Cost, who, with his father, James Cost, on the 23rd day of February 1887, conveyed part of said land to A. J. Naish, has been dead more than three years.
