Fred W.Rogan, being one and the same person as affiant, built a house on said property in the year 1897 and either lived on said property or rented it out contimuously each and every year until 1918, wgch 1 sold same to R F McKibbon, J L McConoughly and F W Rogan, being one and the same person as affiant, as Trustees of the Montevallo Presbyterian Church, said property was enclosed by a gence all the time it was owned by Fred W.Rogan, being one and the same person as affiant, all of said property was used contintously during said time, part being a house site, part being a yard, part being a garden and part being a pasture. Said property was used by said church as a manse and was used and occupied by said church's ministers eachand every year until April 20, 1939, when said property was conveyed to Terrell Pridges. During the time the property was caned by said church, all of it was enclosed by a fence, and was continuously, part being used as a house site, part as a yard, part as a garden and part as a pasture each and every year. Terrell Bridges has been in continuous possession of said property since he purchased it and he has remodeled the dwelling house thereon, and said property, except for the front yard, it still under fence and all of said property in in the active possession of said Terrell Bridges.

Affiant further says the possession of Terrell Bridges, and those through whom he claims, has as far back as affiant can remember to his own knowledge been open, actual, notorious, adverse, hostile, exclusive, peaceful, quiet, continuous and under color of title and elaim of ownership.
