A fifty foot strip of land lying on either side of said center line, beginning at the point of intersection of center line of said road with the South line of SE4 of NE4 of Section 55, Tp. 20 Range 3 West, thence run North 2 deg. 18 min. East a distance of 209 feet to the North line of the property of Mrs. C. L. Smith, Shelby County and for and in consideration of the benefit to my property by reason of the construction of said road, I hereby release the county from all consequential damages, present or prospective to my property, arising out of the construction, maintenance or repair of said road, and that said road is a benefit to my property is hereby admitted and acknowledged.
