Harper, and the possession of those through whom he claims, has as far back as affiant remembers said property, to his own knowledge been open, actual, notorious, adverse, hostile, exclusive, peaceful, quiet, continuous and under claim of ownership and color of title. That affiant has never known of anyone being in possession of said property, claiming adverse to said owners, nor has he known of anyone disputing their title.
