Renfroe Mullins, who has made no agreement or promise to do or admit to do any act or thing not herein set forth, and I further understand that this release is to comprise and terminate all claims of whatever nature, known or unknown, including future developments thereof in any way growing out of or connected, of which may hereinafter grow out of or be connected with said sale.
