All that part of the Southwest quarter of Northwest quarter lying south of the road leading from Enon Church to the Montevallo and Montgomery Road in Section 7, Township 24, Range 13 East, Shelby County, Alabama. Also a strip of land 100 yards wide off the north side of the Northwest quarter of Southwest quarter of Section 7, Township 24, Range 13 East, Shelby County, Alabama.

As early as 1883, when affiant first remembers that part of Southwest Quarter of Northwest quarter of said Section 7, above described, it belonged to George C. Randall, who had it under fence and who cultivated it each and every year until his death, a few years before January, 1908, when his sole and surviving heirs at law conveyed said property to James W. Reid, who went into immediate possession of said property, which at that time had a fence around each foot of it and has continued to have a fence around each foot of it each and every year until this present day, and said James W. Reid has cultivated said property each and every year until this day and has paid taxes on it and has had it in his actual possession since the day he bought it.

When affiant first remembers that part of the above described property in Northwest quarter of Southwest quarter of said section 7, it belonged to Edward C. Seale, who had said property under fence and cultivated parts of it each and every year until 1885, when he sold same to A. B. Crump, who went into immediate possession of said property and farmed parts of it each and every year and kept it under fence continuously until he died, some time before August, 1907, when his sole and surviving heirs at law sold said property to N. B. Robinson, who went into immediate possession of same and kept it under fence continuously and farmed parts of it each and every year until January, 1909, when he sold same to J. W. Reid, being one and the same person, as James W. Reid, who went into immediate possession of said property and has kept each foot of it under fence and has farmed parts of it each and every year until this very day. Affiant has never knowl of P. O. West or Mary Lee West or Caroline Seale or any of their decendants being in possession of or having any interest in said property.

Affiant further says the possession of J. W. Reid, and those through whom he claims, has as far back as affiant can remember to his own knowledge been open, actual, notorious, adverse, hostile, exclusive, peace-ful, quiet, continuous and under color of title and claim of ownership. That affiant has never known of anyone being in possession of said property, claiming adverse to said owners, nor has ne known of anyone disputing their title.
