Before me, Grace Carter, a Notary Public in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Persia Kidd, who is known to me and who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

I am acquainted with all that part of the south west quarter of the north east quarter of Section 18, Township 19, Range 3 East, Shelby County, Alabama, which lies south of Coosa River, said land consisting of about 15 acres, and have known this land for over forty years. I bought this tract of land from J. F. McGraw in 1925, and he executed me a deed which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 75 at page 237, but it now appears that this land was not conveyed in the deed, although it was intended to be conveyed, and there was an error in the description in that deed. Immediately upon the execution of the deed by Mr. McGraw, I went in possession of said fifteen acres lying just south and adjacent to Coosa River and in the south west quarter of the north east quarter of said Section 18, and cultivated portions of it each and every year, down to the present time. There were bout four or five acres in cultivation at the time I bought it from Mr. McGraw and the next year I cleared up about two acres more and now have in cultivated this open and cultivatable land on the 15 acre tract each and every year down to the present time.

Further deposing affiant says: I am the owner of the north half of the south west quarter of the south east quarter of said Section 18. I purchased the 15 acres on the east side of said north half of south west quarter of south east quarter from Lovelace Kidd on the 26th day of June, 1925, by deed which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 75 at page 235, and I also purchased five acres off of the south side of the north west quarter of the south east quarter, all in Section 18, Tp. 19, Range 3 Last, from said Lovelace Kidd, by the same deed above referred to, and immediately upon the execution of said deed I went into possession of said five acre tract and of the 15 acres on the east side of said north half of south west quarter of south east quarter, and began cultivating portions of it and have continued to cultivate portions of it each and every year down to the present time. As a matter of fact, practically all of said 15 acre tract and practically all of said five acre ract was in cultivation when I bought it and/still have it in cultivation.

Further deposing affiant says I own the following described land and have been in the open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession thereof cultivating portions of same each and every year and living upon it for more than ten years prior to this date, viz: Ten acres off the east side of the north east quarter of the north west quarter of Section 19, Township 19, Range 3 East; 25 acres off the east side of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of Section 16; the north east quarter of the south west quarter of Section 18; all that portion of the south west quarter of Lying south of Coosa River the north east quarter of Section 18; 5 acres off the south side of the north west quarter of the south east quarter of Section 18; and the north half of the south west quarter of the south east quarter of Section 18, all in Township 19, Range 3 East, Shelby County, Alabama, except five acres deeded to the State of Alabama, for school purposes and described as follows: West half of south east quarter of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of said Section 18, Township 19, Range 3 East, containing five acres more or less, deed to which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County,

Alabama, in deed book 105 at page 441.
