Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Charley Brown the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the sa,e together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Charley Brown and his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Monroe, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land office to be hereunto affixed.
