Whereas Frederick N. Lee of Shelby County, Alabama has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land office at Tuscaloosa, where by it appears that full payment has been made by the said Frederick N. Lee, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the South east quarter of section twelve in township nineteen of range two west, and the north west quarter of the south west quarter of section seven in township nineteen of range one, west in the district of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing one hundred and nineteen acres and ninety four hundredths of an acre, according to theofficial plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Frederick N. Lee.

Now Know Ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Frederick N. Lee and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Frederick N. Lee and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchannan, President of the Unites States of America, have caused these Letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land office to be hereunto affixed.
