I am a son of J. R. Bridges deceased. The said J. R. Bridges died on or about the 24th day of April, 1920. A short while prior to his death he executed the mortgage to J. C. Nabors on the lands in Section Two (2), Township Twenty-two (22), Range Three (3), West, Shelby County, Alabama recorded in Mortgage Book 125, at page 401, Records of Mortgages in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama. At the time my father died he left considerable life insurance and also money in Birmingham banks, said life insurance being payable to my mother, Exie Bridges, A short while after my father died my mother paid the indebtedness secured by the aforesaid mortgage and about three years after my father died my mother's residence burned and all of her land papers including said mortgage was burned. My father left surviving him, my mother, who never married again after his death, and who died July 28, 1940. My father left surviving him the following children of him, myself, Russell M. Bridges, Mary B. Cunningham, Milton L. Bridges, John W. Bridges, Granville M. Bridges, James L. Bridges, and Elda Ora Bridges. Each of whom is over twenty-one years of age. My father did not leave surviving him, and there is not now surviving him, and there has not been since his death surviving him any child or children of a deceased child of him.
