

AFFIDAVIT OF MRS. MAUDE L. NEVIN 284

Before the undersigned authority in and for said County and State personally appeared Mrs. Maude L. Nevin, who on oath says: I am 51 years of age and reside at "Wilsonville, Alabama. I am the daughter of Mrs. Mary A. Powers, a widow. My mother was the only child of Mrs. Eva Madison, nee Woods who was the only sister that Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Dobbs ever had. They had only one brother who died unmarried in boyhood.

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Dobbs my great-aunt married first W. G. Crawford who died some two years before her marriage to W. S. Dobbs about 1910. She died in November, 1920 and was buried at Wilsonville. She had no children by either of her marriages.

Mary Elizabeth Dobbs was Mary Elizabeth Crawford in April, 1905 and on August 30, 1906 on which dates deeds shown by Deed Book 109 page 227 and page 330 where made to her under the name of M. E. Crawford, she being the identical person to whom such deeds were made.

At the time of her death Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Dobbs owned and was in possession of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 23; E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Sec. 24, and SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and E $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 24; and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 25, all Township 19, Range 1 East in Shelby County, Alabama and her surviving husband, W. S. Dobbs has remained in possession of such land down to the present time.
