I am acquainted with the south west quarter of the north west quarter of Section 11, Township 20, Range 3 West, Shelby County, Alabama. I knew W. T. Braswell in his life time. Mr. Braswell acquired this property through deed of R. N. Roy in 1900, according to my best recollection. Mr. Braswell went in possession of this forty acre tract of land, and cultivated protions of it, or had it cultivated, each and every year until a very short time before he died, and from then until the time he died he either had it cultivated by tenants or put it in pasture, up to the time of his death, except, of course, portions of it which he deeded away. He sold and deeded to Paramount Coal Company that portion of said forty north of the spur track leading from the Acton branch of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad past its tipple and mine. In my estimation there are about four acres north of this spur track, that he deeded the Paramount Coal Company. With the exception of that, as stated, Mr. Braswell was in the actual, open, continuous, notorious, exclusive, adverse possession of the property from the time he acquired it from Mrl Roy until he died, and his widow and children have been in possession of it ever since, cultivating it or having it cultivated or having it in pasture.
