Dike and to his heirs, the said tracts above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunites, and appurtenences, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Arthur A. Dike, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
