

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, Mark E. Moore, of St. Clair County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa, State of Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Mark E. Moore according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South East Quarter of Section fourteen, in Township Nineteen, of Range two East in the District of Tuscaloosa and State of Alabama containing one hundred and Sixty acres and thirty seven hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Mark E. Moore.

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Mark E. Moore and to his heirs the said tract above described: To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Mark E. Moore and his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, James Monroe PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
