KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) dollar to me E.D. Holliday and Camma G. Holliday, his wife, in hand paid by Henry W. Perry and John P. Newsome, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we do remise, release, quit claim and convey to said Henry W. Perry Jr., and John P. Newsome, all our right, title, interest, and claim in or to the following described real estate, situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

The E $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 26; and the E $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 35, in Township 17 Range 1 East, Shelby County, Alabama

This deed made to supplement deed dated December 20th, 1940 wherein an error was made and recorded in deed book 110 page 19 Shelby County Alabama.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD to the said Henry W. Perry and John P. Newsome, their heirs, and assigns forever.
