Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Wiley Allen, who being duly sworn deposes and says that he resides in Shelby County, and that for a period of _____ years, last past, he has been acquainted with the hereinafter described lambs situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

A part of the southeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 28, Township 21, Range 4 west, lying along the west side of Tuscaloosa road described as follows: Commence at iron stake 55 feet west of said Tuscaloosa road for a point of beginning, thence 55 feet east to west boundary of said road, thence north direction along said western boundary for a distance of 80 feet, thence in a western direction for a distance of 74 feet, thence in a southerly directionfor a distance of 80 feet to point of beginning. This parcel beingthe same as conveyed to Wiley Allen by deed from E.G. Walker and wife, under date of 24th Dec., 1928 and later conveyed to E.L. Green by deed from Wiley Allen and wife.

Affiant further says that he has been familiar with the use and occupancy of said lot since the date of purchase by your affiant from the said E.G. Walker and your affiant knows that the said T.W. Holley and those through whom the said Holley holds title to the above described lot, namely: E.L. Green Wiley Allen and E.G. Walker, respectively, have been in the open, notorious, continuous, peaceable and adverse possession of said lot, and claiming to own the same respectively, against all the world, and exercising acts of ownership over the same; affiant further says that he has never heard the title of the said T.W. Holley or those through whom he holds title to said lands to be questioned in any way. Affiant further says that he has never heard the heirs at law of the said E.G. Walker and wife Ellen Walker, make any claim to own any interest in said lends since the death of said E.G. Walker and Ellen Walker,
