Before me the undersigned authority in and for said State and County, personally appeared George Harrison who, being by me first duly sworn says that he is now employed by the Montevallo Coal Mining Company in the capacity of a deputy sheriff and has been so employed since the organization of the Company in 1925; that since that date and for many years prior thereto he has been familiar with the following described lands:

All of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 17, except one acre in the Northeast corner of that Quarter-Quarter section which is in the shape of a square, and also all of that part of the East Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 18, which lies on the Southeast side of the right of way of the Southern Railway Company formerly the B.B.&B. Railroad Company, all situated in Township 22, Range 3 West, in Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further states that it is a part of his duty to look after all of the properties of the Company; that since the time the Company acquired the lands from the Trustee in Bankruptcy in 1925, it has been in open, notorious, adverse and peaceable possession of said lands; that during a part of that period the Company leased the lands to Mr. George Brown who cultivated the same as a tenant of the Company; that the dwelling house which has been on the land since a time antedating the acquisition of the land by the Company, has been continuously occupied by employees of the Company as tenants of the Company; that he has never known of any person making any claim to those lands adverse to the interests of the Montevallo Coal Mining Company.
