My name is William Watters Bolin, and my brother, Charles Frederick Bolin, and I were complainants in that certain suit recently pending in the Circuit Court of Shelby County, Alabama, in Equity, in which Tyler Frances Bolin WWilby, et al, were respondents, the same being case number 1660 on the docket of said court, and in which an amended bill of complaint was filed on the 11th day of June, 1940.

After the original bill was filed my sister, Tyler Frances Bolin Wilby, died and the facts as to the heirs at law of said Tyler Frances Bolin Wilby are correctly set up in the amended bill of complaint. She left no husband, no children nor descendants of children.

The sole heirs at law and next of kin of kin of my father, John W. Bolin, deceased, who, for something over forty years, was the owner of and in possession of the lands sold, as well as the east half of the south east quarter of the south west quarter of Section 3, Township 21, Range 1 East, Shelby County, Alabama, were myself and my brother, the other complainant in said cause, and the respondents named in the amended bill of complaint, except the respondent, Marie McEwen Bolin, the surviving widow of Walter M. Bolin, who was a deceased son of my father, John W.Bolin.

The respondent, Margaret Dyar was a grand-daughter of said John W.Bolin, and was a sister of Bolin DuBdse. Her name is spelled Dyar and Not Dyer. The name, however, is used interchangeably and sometimes it is spelled Dyar and sometimes Dyer.

The respondent, Bolin DuBose is also known as Wiles Bolin DuBose, and he usually signs his name W. Bolin DuBose, but the hame by which he commonly goes is merely Bolin DuBose.

The respondents, Margaret Dyar and Bolin DuBose, were and are the sole surviving heirs at law of one of my deceased sisters, who married a DuBose. Her husband survived her but died before the filing of the amended bill of complaint in this cause.

The complainants and respondents named in the bill of complaint were the same at the time of the filing of the decree of sale, at the time of sale and at the time of the decree of distribution in the chancery suit above referred to, as at the time the amended bill of complaint referred to was filled in said cause number 1660, in the Circuit Court of Shelby County, Alabama, June, 1940, and continuously from that date, were and are as follows:

William Watters Bolin, a son, over 21 years of age, residing in Shelby County, Alabama.

Charles Frederick Bolin, a son, over 21 years of age, residing in New Orleans, La.

Sallie Bolin Tinney, a daughter, over 21 years of age, residing at Talladega Alabama.

John William Bolin, a son, over 21 years of age, residing in Vicksburg, Miss.

Laura Bolin Hafelfinger, a daughter over 21 years of age, residing at the Imperial Hotel New York City. Edith Bolin Martin, a daughter, over 21 years of age, residing at 2000 Madison Avenue, Memphin Tenn.

Margaret Dyar and Bolin DuBose, each over 21 years of age, and being the sole surviving heirs at law of a deceased daughter of said John W.Bolin, deceased, both of whom at the time the bill of complaint in this cause was filedresided in Chilton County, Alabama, but who later moved to the State of Texas. Their father and mother were both dead at the time the amended bill of complaint in the aforementioned cause was filed.

Robert Bolin and Jack Bolin, who are the sole surviving heirs at law of a deceased son of said John W.Bolin, -Robert Bolin being over 21 years of age and residing at Atlanta in the State of Georgia and said Jack Bolin, being a minor over 14 years of age, and residing with his mother, Marie McEwen Bolin, in the State of Florida.

I have kept up with the administration of the estate of ny father in the Probate Court of Shelby County, Alabama; there were no debts against my father's estate, none actually existed and none were proven and the records in the Probate Office of Shelb y County, Alabama, which I have investigated, showno claims whatsoever as being filed in the administration proceeding.

My sister, Mrs Tyler Frances Bolin Wilby, also known as Mrs. Tyler Wilby; my brother, Charles Frederick Bolin, is dalso known as Charles F. Bolin, or Charlie Bolin, and my brother John William Bolin is also known as John W. Bolin, Jr; my sister, Laura Bolin Hafelfinger was and is also known as Almeda Hafelfinger; my sister, Edith Bolin Martin is also known as Edith Martin, and I am known by the name of W. W. Bolin; my sister, Sallie Bolin Tinney, is also known as Sallie Tinney; my father, John W. Bolin, was also known as J. W. Bolin, Sr.
