do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said K.P. Fulmer and wife, Lillie Louise Fulmer

the following described real estate, to-wit: That part of the Northwest diagonal Half of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 15, Township 19, Range 2 West, described as follows: Beginning at the southwest corner of said Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of said Section 15, and runs thence northeast along the diagonal line running from the southwest corner of the above described 40, a distance of 420 feet to a point; run thence in a northwesterly direction a distance of 383 feet, more or less, to a point on the western boundary line of said Northeast Quarter of Northwest Quarter of said Section 15 to a point 419 feet north of the southwest corner of said Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of said Section 15; run thence south along the west line of said last named 40, a distance of 419 feet to the point of beginning, all being in Section 15, Township 19, Range 2 West, and containing 2 acres, more or less.
