THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greetings:

WHEREAS, Edmunds King of Shelby County Has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa in Alabama whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edmund King according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled " An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands, for the east half of the South West quarter of Section eleven , of Township Twenty-One- of Range Three West in the district of Tuscaloosa and State of Alabama Containing Seventy-Nine acres and ninety five hundredth of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edmund King

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Edmund King the said tract above described: To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto, belonging, unto the said Edmund King and his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I James Monroe, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office is to be hereunto affixed
