## LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JAMES WILLIAMS.

I, James Williams, of Montevallo, Alabama, Shelby County, being of sound mind and disposing memory and being mindful of the uncertainty of life and of the certainty of death, do hereby make and publich this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills, if any, by me made, VIZ:

ITEM ONE. It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as possible.

THEM TWO. I will, devise and bequeath to my wife, Josephine Williams, all of the personal or mixed property of which I may die seized and possessed or to which I may be entitled in equity at the time of my death,

ITEM THREE. I will, devise and bequeath to my wife, Josephine Williams, all the real estate of which I may die seized and possessed, or to which I may be entitled in equity at the time of my death, for and during the term of her natural life, and at her death, I will, devise and bequeath said property to my son and to the estate of Henry Williams.

ITEM FOUR. I hereby appoint my son, Henry Williams as Administrator of this my last will and testament, without bond and without the necessity of accounting to any court for his actions as such administrator. In witness whereof I, the said James Williams, have this my last will and testament subscribed my name on this 7th day of September 1940.
