The East half of the South East quarter of Section thirteen, in Township nineteen, of Range two East, in the District of Lands office for sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing eighty acres and twenty two hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Lemuel Moore.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and Granted, and, by these presents, do give, unto the said Lemuel Moore and to his heirs the said tract above described unto him and to Hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Lemuel Moore and to his heirs and assigns forever.
