

AFFIDAVIT

Before me, L. C. Walker, the undersigned authority in and for said County in said State personally appeared C. S. Seale who, after being by me first duly sworn to speak the truth deposes and says he is 45 years old and has lived near the property described below practically all of his life and has all along been well acquainted with it and with the persons in possession of it. Said property being described as follows:

The S₂¹ of SW₄¹ of SW₄¹ of Section 16;

The S $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17;

The NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20;

And Fraction D in Section 21; all being in Township 22, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant first remembers said property when he was ten or eleven years old. At that time, it belonged to John Winslett, who lived on it and farmed parts of it, used parts of it as a pasture, and obtained firewood and building lumber from the wooded part of it each and every year until about three years prior to his death on December 14, 1928. During said three years, he rented it out to Mr. Pierce Barley, a tenant, who farmed parts of said property and used part of it as a pasture and obtained firewood and building timber from the wooded parts each and every years until about the time of said John Winslett's death. After the death of John Winslett, his wife, Emma Winslett and children took possession of said property and held the same until the said Emma Winslett's death on October 1, 1930, at which time the three children of said John Winslett and Emma Winslett, namely: O. W. Winslett, Mary Fannie Winslett Horton, and Carroll Winslett, being the sole and surviving heirs at law of John Winslett and Emma Winslett took possession of said property and lived on it and farmed it and used parts of it for pasture and obtained firewood and building lumber from it until this very day. However, Carroll Winslett an unmarried woman, died intestate, May 10, 1932, and O. W. Winslett, an unmarried man, died intestate, October 6, 1939. Neither John Winslett nor Emma Winslett left a Will and there has been no Administration on their Estate, but I've never known of anyone having any claims against them since their death.

I have never known of W. E. Harrison nor Preston A. Bristow nor A. B. Bristow having any interest whatsoever in said land.

The possession of Mary Fannie Winslett Horton and the possession of those persons through whom she claims, has as far back as affiant can remember to his own knowledge been open, actual, notorious, adverse, hostile, exclusive, peaceful, quiet, continuous and under color of title and claim of ownership. The affiant has never known of anyone being in possession of said property, claiming adverse to said owners, nor has he known of anyone disputing their title.
