according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edward Lewis

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Nicholes M. Marks the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenance, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Nicholas M. Marks and his heirs and assigns forever.
