THE UNITED STATE OF AMERICA, To all to whom these
presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Columbus Benton has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law for the

North East quarter of Section six, in Township twenty one South; of
Range four West of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama, containing one
hundred and sixty acres and twenty eight hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Columbus Benton the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Columbus Benton and to his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

GIVEN under my hand, at the City of Washington, the eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and eighteen-th.
