## AFFIDAVIT

Before the undersigned authority personally appeared J.F. McGraw, Sr. who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn deposeth and says:

I am acquainted with Mr. B.F. Day and his wife, C.E. Day, to whom W.T. Oaks and wife, Mary L. Oakes, executed a deed on the 2nd day of October, 1908, and which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 29 at page 303 . The only children of Mrs. C.E. Day, and who constitute her sold heirs at law and next of kin are as follows:

- 1. Mallard Day, whose wife is Evalene Day
- 2. Katie Day Bradford, a daughter, who is a widow
- 3. L.E. Day Carroll, a daughter, whose husband is Jim Carroll.
