NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES, and in further consideration of the sum of One Hundred and No/100 to us in hand paid by B. F. Creamer, J. C. Goff, P. E. Baker, as trustees of the Congregational Holiness Church at Saginaw, Alabama, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we the said S. T. Vanderslice and wife Tencie Vanderslice do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said B. F. Creamer, J. C. Goff, and P. E. Baker, as trustees of the Congregational Holiness Church at Saginaw, Alabama, and their successors in office in trust for the use of said church, with all the rights to menage and control said property with the power to mortgage and convey the same in the manner and only in the manner prescribed in the "Discipline of the Congregational Holiness Church", the following described real estate situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

Begin at the south east corner of the north west quarter of the north east quarter of Section 18, Township 21, Range 2 West, Shelby County, Alabama, thence run north 2 degrees 15 minutes west along the east boundary line of said forty 256 feet, thence south 89 degrees 45 minutes west 446.7 feet to a point 25 feet east from the center line of the Birmingham-Montgomery highway, which last named point is the beginning point of the lot herein conveyed; thence south 40 degrees 30 minutes east 150 feet, along the right of way of said highway, thence north 89 degrees 45 minutes east 90 feet, thence north 2 degrees 15 minutes west 90 feet, thence south 89 degrees 45 minutes west 150 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning.
