TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 14.554 for Eighty acres, issued in favor of Robert Turner Private in Captain, Brannon's Company, South Carolina Militia War 1812 has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

South half of the South East quarter of Section Fourteen in Township Twenty Two of Range Three West in the district of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing eighty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned to John Alexander.

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John Alexander the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John Alexander and to his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I Millard Fillmore PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereuntoaffixed.
