I am acquaintedwith the following described real estate situated in Shelby County, Alabama, and have known the same for forty years or more, viz:

All of the E¹₂ of NW¹₄ of Section 20, Tp. 21, Range 1 East which lies north and northwest of the Mardis Ferry road, and also the NE¹₄ of NE¹₄ of Section 20, Tp. 21, Range 1 East, and also all of the NW¹₄ of NE¹₄ of Section 20, Tp. 29, Range 1 East except the following portion thereof, to-wit: Begin at the SE corner of said forty and run S 87 deg W along south line of said forty 752.7 feet for a point of beginning of the tract herein excepted, thence run north 20 deg. west 680.5 feet to the south line of the Mardis Ferry road, thence southwesterly along the south line of said road to the west line of said forty, thence south along the west line of said forty to the SW corner of said forty, thence east along the south line of said forty to the point of beginning, containing 5.1 acres.
