Before me, the undersigned authority, in and for said County, in said State, personally appeared P. J. Shaw and Mrs. P. J. Shaw, who, being first duly sworn, depose and say that they reside in Shelby County, Alabama, and in the Montevallo community; that for a period of more than forty years, last past, they have been acquainted with the location, boundaries, owners and parties in possession of the following described lands situated near the town of Montevallo in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the South line of the Montevallo and Aldrich public road with the North and South center line of Section 20, Township 22, Range 3 West, at or near the center of said Section, and running thence Northwesterly and West, respectively, along the South line of said public road to the intersection of the same with the West line of the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of said Section; thence South along the last mentioned line and beyond and along the West line of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of said Section to a point on said last mentioned line 1356 feet, more or less, South of said public road, the said point being the Northwest corner of the Alabama Technical Institute property, how known as the Alabama College property, and formerly the John D. McMath property; thence in a general Northeasterly direction along the irregular line of said Institute property to the point of beginning. The said property hereby described being partly in the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter and partyly in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 20, Township 22, Range 3 West, and being all of what was formerly called the Frank R.
