TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS Abner^{A.} and John E. Hughes of Shelby County have deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Abner^{A.} and John E. Hughes according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the West half of the South-east quarter of section twenty-one in Township twenty-one of Range one, East, in the district of lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing eighty acres and six hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Abner A. and John E. Hughes.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Abner A. and John E. Hughes, and to their heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Abner A and John E. Hughes, and to their heirs and assigns forever, as tenants in Common, and not as tenants.

In testimony whereof, I, John Quincy Adams, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and of the Independence of the United States the fifty first.
