KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT I, Sam Klotzman, a Private in the United States Army, being desirous of appointing an attorney-in-fact, to act for me and on my behalf on all matters in which I may have an interest, do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife, Rose M. Klotzman, of Montevallo, Alabama, my true and lawful attorney-in-fact, with full power to pledge, mortgage, or execute deeds of trust for, sell, transfer, assign, exchange or otherwise dispose of any or all of my property, real, personal or mixed, under such terms or conditions as she may deem proper, and to execute and deliver good and sufficient instruments for the accomplishment thereof; to collect, sue, compromise or otherwise dispose of any claim or debt to which I now or hereafter may have an interest; to pay, compromise, or otherwise discharge and secure releases from any obligations or claims against me; to deposit in my name and for my account with any bank, banker, or trust company any checks which may come into her hands as such attorney, and all moneys, bills of exchange, drafts, promissory notes, and other securities for money payable or belonging to me, and for that purpose to sign my name and endorse the same for deposit or collection, and from time to time to withdraw any and all moneys deposited with the aforesaid depositaries or any other depository now or hereafter having moneys belonging to me, and for that purpose to draw checks in my name to execute vouchers in my behalf for any and all allowances and reimbursements properly payable to me by the United States, including but not restricted to allowances and reimbursements for transportation of dependents or for shipment of household effects as authorized by law and Army Regulations, and to receive, endorse, and collect the proceeds of checks payable to the order of the undersigned drawn on the Treasurer of the United States, to borrow money in my name and to execute in my name promissory note; to lease property in my name and to execute and deliver good and sufficient instruments for the accomplishment thereof.

FURTHER, I do authorize my aforesaid attorney-in-fact to perform all necessary acts in the execution of the aforesaid authorizations and I do hereby expressly declare that the powers herein granted to my aforesaid attorney-in-fact shall not be construed as limited to those matters hereinbefore specifically set forth, but rather shall be construed to broadly include and embrace full and unlimited power and authority to do and perform, on my behalf and in my place and stead, and with equal validity, any and all other acts or things which I could do if personally present; hereby ratifying and confirming whatsoever my said attorney shall and may do, by virtue hereof, in the premises.

FURTHER, This power of attorney shall remain in full force and effect until revoked by me by the execution and recording in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, of a proper instrument to effectuate such revocation.

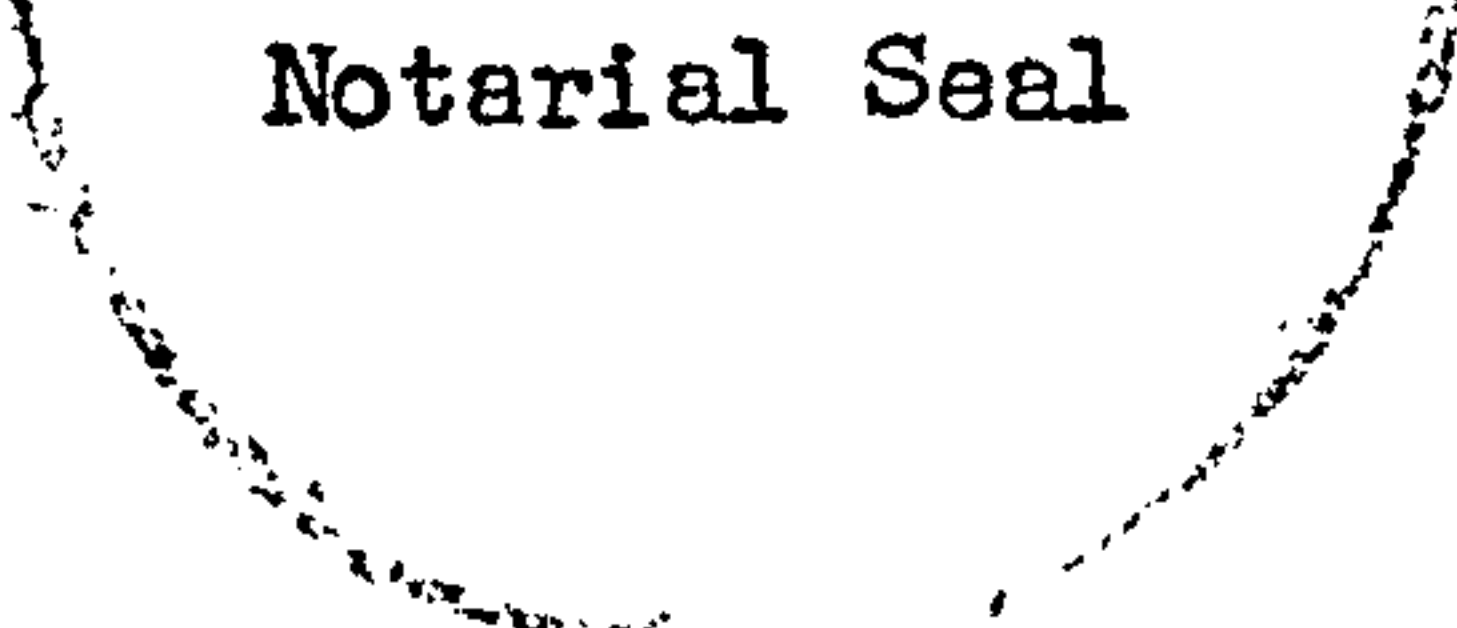
