Merrill and Willard Merrill, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Carl R. Jones and R. E. Smith, the following described real estate, to-wit:

The Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 2, and all that part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 2, lying West of the right of way of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company, all in Township 24, Range 13 East.

Also, the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 11, and all that part of the Northeast Quarter of the North-west Quarter of Section 11, lying West of the right of way of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company, all in Township 24, Range 13, East.

There is EXCEPTED, However, from this Warranty any interest heretofore conveyed to the State of Alabama, or to Shelby County, for the use of a public highway right of way,
