

## AFFIDAVIT

Before me, the undersigned authority in and for said County, in said State, personally appeared Pat Harrison, who, being first duly sworn deposes and says that he resides at Montevallo, in Shelby County, Alabama, and that for a period of more than sixty years, last past, he has been acquainted with the location, owners, parties in possession, and the boundaries of the following described lands situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to wit:

The North Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 8, Township 22, Range 3 West, EXCEPT 4.35 acres, more or less, in the Southeast corner thereof, lying East of the Dogwood public road, and known and designated as Lot 13 on the map according to McGaughy's Survey.

Also, the South Half of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter, and the South Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, and the North Half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter all in Section 8, Township 22, Range 3 West, and containing 135 acres, more or less.

Affiant further says that Thomas Harrison, the grantee in the certain deeds recorded in Deed Book "R", page 492; Deed Book 5, page 205; Deed Book 5, page 188, all in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, was the grandfather of your affiant, and that Louisa Harrison was the wife of the said Thomas Harrison, and she was the grandmother of your affiant.

Affiant further says that the grantors and the grantee in that certain deed from Louisa Harrison George T. Harrison and wife, Mary Harrison, W. W. Harrison and wife, Fannie Harrison, and Sallie Harrison, an unmarried woman, to T. F. Harrison, dated October 6, 1883, and recorded in Deed Book 5 and conveying the above described lands, were all of the heirs-at-law, and next of kin of Thomas Harrison, deceased, who departed this life during the month of November, 1881; affiant further says that T. F. Harrison was the father of your affiant, and that Mattie Harrison was the mother of your affiant and that she departed this life on, or about the 29th. day of September, 1914.

Affiant further says that the grantors and the grantee in that certain deed from T. F. Harrison, a widower, Pat Harrison and wife, Hattie Harrison, Walter Harrison, being the same person as W. C. Harrison, a widower, Mamie Allen, a widow, Tom Harrison, being the one the same person as T. R. Harrison, and wife, Geneva Harrison, Henry Harrison and wife, Lula Harrison, Minnie Carson and husband, Ernest Carson, Anna Jeffries and her husband, Henry Jeffries, ~~Ethel Carson, Anna Jeffries and her husband, Henry Jeffries, Ethel Carson and her husband, Will Carson, and Luther Harrison,~~ were all of the heirs-at-law and next of kin of Mattie Harrison and her husband, T. F. Harrison, dated in 1919 and filed on November, 15, 1919, conveying the above described lands and recorded in Deed Book 65 on page 526 in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further says that he knows of his own personal knowledge for the past sixty years that neither James L. McGaughy, S. F. McGaughy, J.T. McGaughy, Mary I. McGaughy, Lloyd Franklin McGaughy Mary Ida McGaughy, have ever been in the possession, or claimed any part of the above described lands other than the 4.35 acres situated in the Southeast corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest



Quarter of Dogwood road, in Section 8, Township 22, Range 3 West.

Affiant further says that of his own personal knowledge he knows that for sixty years, last past, that Frank Moody and wife, Lottie Moody and those through whom the said Frank Moody and Lottie Moody hold title, namely; T. F. Harrison, being the one and same person as Thomas F. Harrison, Mattie Harrison, the heirs-at law of Mattie Harrison, Luther Harrison, Geneva Harrison, respectively, to the above described lands, have been respectively in the open, notorious, continuous, peaceable, and adverse possession of the said lands, claiming the same as their own, respectively, against all the world, and exercising acts of ownership of said lands by residing thereon, and regularly cultivating the cleared lands thereon in agricultural crops, and using other parts of the same for pasture and woodland purposes; that the affiant has never heard the title, boundaries, location, or right of possession of the said Frank Moody and wife, Lottie Moody or those through whom they hold title, to be questioned in any way.
