From the time I got the deed in 1923 I have been in the open, exclusive, undispute notorious and adverse possession of said land, claiming it as my own and nobody else has ever claimed any right, title or interest in said land or any part of it since I got the deed. The land was sold for taxes in 1932, but I redeemed it in June 1933 and remained in possession from the date of sale to the time of reredemption without interruption and have remained in possession ever since without interruption of any sort. Mr. Wilder was in possession of the land at the time he deeded the land to me. The statement in the deed to me that the tract in $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 28, Tp 18, Range 2 East is $32\frac{1}{4}$ acres is an error. There is only 3 acres in that tract and only about $32\frac{1}{4}$ acres in all that I got from Mr. Wilder.
