Personally came and appeared before me, S. A. Lokey, a Notary Public for the State of Alabama at Large, P. T.TEmplin, who after being by me first duly sworn according to law to speak the truth, deposeth and says:

My name is P. T. Templin. I am 57 years of age and have lived in Shelby County all of my life. I am and have been well acquainted with the following described real estate and those in possession of it sine I can remember, to-wit:

The Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter and the West half of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 2 and the northwest Quarter and Northwest quarte of Northeast Quarter of Section 11 all in Township 21, Range 1 East.

Except the Chapel Church and grave yards lots containing 2 acres more or less and also except the right of way of the Southern Railroad and the right of way of the paved highway through said land.

when I was a boy, Mr. Jessie Taylor owned and lived on above described land, cultivating parts, pasturing parts, cutting wood from parts and in every way using said land as a farm and homestead until about 1911 when he sold to Jack Taylor who rented it to tennants for several years who lived on and cultivated it until about the year 1918 when Jack Taylor sold the above described land to Williamd W. Davis who bookimmediate possession and lived on and dultivated said farm, pasturing parts, cutting wood from parts and in every way using it as a homestead and farm for about two years when he sold to one, W. J. Mobbs. Mobbs lived lived on and cultivated said land, pasutring parst and cutting wood from parts and in every way using it as the homestead and farm for about two years when he re-conveyed to Williard W. Davis and shortly thereafter the said Willard W. Lavis conveyedabove described land to Mrs. Dee Waldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough about the year 1923.

Immediately after Mrs. Dee Waldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough bought said land in 1923 they rented it to one, Off Hill who lived on and cultivated it for one or two years. The place then stayed vacant for one or two years when the said Mrs. Descwaldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough rented it to Henry Taylor who cultivated it one or two years. Said owners then rented said farm to one, W. H. Tolbert who lived upon said farm cultivating parts, pasturing parts and cutting wood from parts and in every way using is as a homestead and farm paying rent annually to owners until the year 1943, said Mrs. Dee Waldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough then rented above described land to affiant and I immidetaly took possession of said land and moved thereon and have since and am now living there, pasturing parts, cultivating parts and cutting wood from parts and every way using it as and home and farm.

Possession of the above mentioned Mrs. Dee Weldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough and their predesessors in title as above named has been since my recollection, actual, peaceful, quite, open, notorious, exculsive, direct, adverse, hostile and under color of title and claim of ownership except that the deed from W. J. Mobbs to Willard W. Davis does not appear of record and I have no personal knowledge of whether or not W. J. Mobbs reconveyed to W. W. Davis, but it was my understanding that he did reconvey and I do know that he surrendered possession to Willard W. Davis as above stated about the year 1922 and I know that the said W. J. Mobbs has not been in possession of any part of said land since about the year 1922 nor has any one been in possession claiming under him except as above stated. I am well acquainted with M. F. Taylor who executed permit to the Alabama Power Company on October 2, 1945, which is recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate for Shelby County Alabama in Deed Book 123 at page 52. At that time M. F. Taylor was bargaining to buy said farm but the transaction was never consimated and he was never in possession of any part of above described land at any time.

Neither has anyone else been in possession of any part of the above described land claiming to own it othern then those above named since I can remember nor have I ever known of anyone disputing the title of Mrs. Dee Waldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarprough.

williard W. Davis who executed mortgage to Federal Land Bank on August 5, 1919 which is recorded in the office of the Judge of Probate for Shelby County, Alabama in Mortgage Record 130 at page 6 is one and thesame person as the W. W. Davis who conveyed said property to Mrs. Dee Waldrop and Mrs. Nannie Scarbrough on April 25, 1923 by deed recorded in the Probate Office for Shelby County, Alabama in Heed Book 72 at page 587.
