J. E. Mahan died about February, 1931 and his widow, Mary L. Mahan, still holds possession fo said land under late husband's title,; it sold for 1939 taxes in 1938, I understand, but said Mary L. Mahan redeemed it in 1939 as Mrs. J. E. Mahan.
